Gravit Spirit Design Due: 4th period, Thursday 9/24/20 by midnight 3rd & 7th periods, Friday 9/25/20 by midnight

For this assignment you will create a poster design promoting school spirit for our Analy Tiger community.

First, open a new Gravit document (US Letter Portrait 8.5 x 11).

On this blank "page" create a poster that promotes Analy school spirit. If you are a 10th grader or higher you might think about a club or student organization or activity that you particularly miss in our distance learning environment and make that the theme of your poster (for example, I certainly miss our ping pong club, which I'm the faculty sponsor for, but you might miss being on an active sports team, or the debate team, etc...) If you are a freshman, you can just work to imagine what you might have been involved with, or you can keep your poster Tiger themed, since we are the Analy Tigers.

You may use images from the Internet. I recommend doing a Google search and using the phrase "line art", for example "tiger line art", or "ping pong line art" as a way to get black and white images that will be easier to work with in Gravit. Then you can either copy the images or download and then import them, or you can simply take screen shots of them and use the screen shot in Gravit. Under the File menu in Gravit there is an Import item and inside of that a Place Image option. Or you can copy and paste images directly in.

Save early, save often, so you don't create a cool poster and then have Gravit glitch and make you start over. Name your project "spirit poster" with your name in the title.

When you're done please make sure you have satisfied these requirements:

- 1. Your poster is fun.
- 2. Your poster is school appropriate.
- 3. Your poster has at least one interesting graphic.
- 4. Your poster has the word Analy on it somewhere.
- 5. Your poster celebrates school spirit or the potential community our school offers, particularly when we get back to in-person learning.
